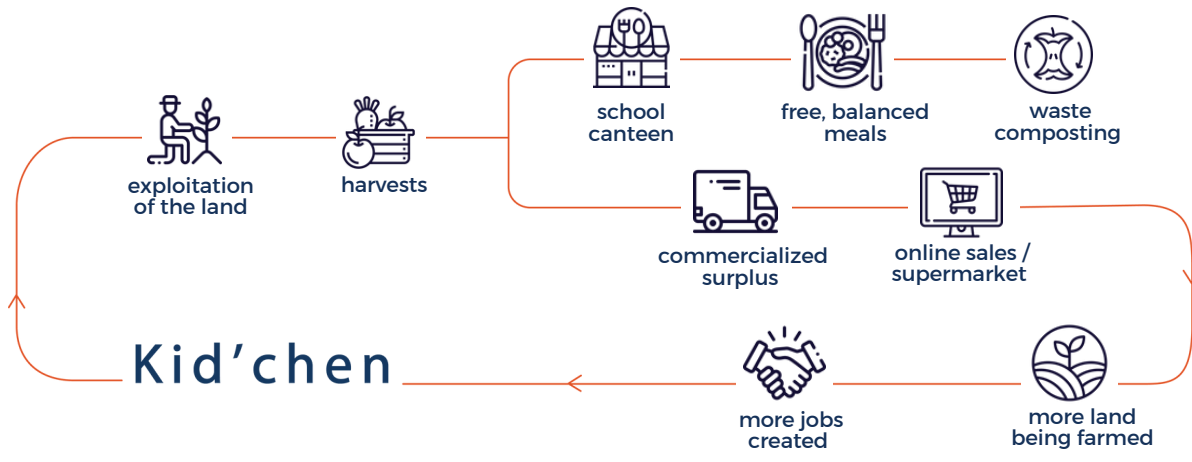


When agriculture is at the service of education.



By applying a social and solidarity economy model, Wallah We Can presents a sustainable solution to fight malnutrition in schools by making them food self-sufficient. We trained unemployed parents in sustainable agriculture and employed them to farm 8 hectares of land. The fruits and vegetables grown and harvested are distributed directly to the canteens. Then, the surplus of the production is commercialized to self-finance the project.

2- The beneficiaries:

The parents of students

Unemployed adults trained in agriculture have a fair wage, social security coverage and safe transportation. This results in a better work culture and better living conditions.

The students

Students will benefit from free, balanced nutrition, which will result in better concentration in class, better education, and fewer dropout cases.

3- Key figures (pilot project):

8 hectares of land are cultivated

9 new jobs created for students' parents

104,000 free balanced menus per year

150 tons of fruits and vegetables harvested per year
