WALLAH WE CAN LEBANON

At Wallah We Can Worldwide, a GreenSchool project is being developed in Lebanon within the Antonine Sisters Orphanage, located in Achkout (Keserwan), approximately 30 km from Beirut.

This 33,000 m² site is home to between 80 and 100 orphans, including children and young adults.

The project aims to transform the orphanage into a self-sustaining educational and agricultural ecosystem, based on the core principles of the GreenSchool model: education, environmental sustainability, and both energy and economic autonomy.



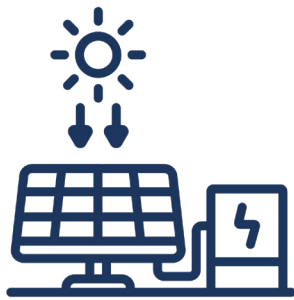
MAIN ACTIONS CARRIED OUT



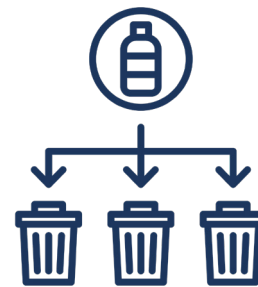
Treatment of water infiltration and waterproofing works on the building.



Rehabilitation of facades, painting, and carpentry.



Installation of photovoltaic panels (stabilization of electricity supply).



Improvement of water management and reduction of waste.



Implementation of a fire safety system.



APPROACH

Wallah We Can presents this project as the deployment of its GreenSchool model adapted to the Lebanese context.

The renovation project is not limited to renovating the building and achieving energy self-sufficiency: it forms part of a long-term vision aimed at strengthening the orphanage's overall self-sufficiency.

Following the initial rehabilitation phase, the project plans to develop agricultural activities within the orphanage. These activities aim to contribute to food self-sufficiency, reduce operating costs, and provide children with a meaningful educational environment that fosters learning, responsibility, and a connection to the land.





EXPECTED IMPACT

- Improvement of children's safety and living conditions.
- Enhanced access to electricity through the installation of photovoltaic panels, helping to address daily power shortages.
- Long-term sustainability of an essential care and accommodation facility.
- Meeting these criteria will enable the orphanage to obtain the GreenSchool label.
